Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to Drinnick Class – Year 5

We hope you had a lovely Christmas and are looking forward to the new year! If you have any questions about the content of this letter or any other concerns at all, please don't hesitate to pop in after school or ring me on the above number.

Our Drinnick team this term consists of Mr. Barritt (class teacher), and Mrs Williams (Class TA and HLTA – class cover).

Curriculum:

Our topic for the start of this term is called **'Fire On Film'**. This Unit is designed to take pupils on an exciting journey back in time to 17th Century London in the era of The Great Fire. This is the London of Charles 11, Sir Christopher Wren and the diarists Samuel Pepys and John Evelyn.

Pupils will be making a film based on the events surrounding the fire. They will use a range of ICT tools to produce and edit their film, with e-safety being at the forefront of the topic. There is lots of information about the Great Fire for children online. Try the BBC Bitesize website as a good starting point. Other links can be found on our class page on the school website. Any other resources you are able to find (for example, books at the library) would be a real help and, as always, children are welcome to 'show and tell' any topic related material they bring in from home.

We feel that a cross curricular approach is key to maintaining interest and real life relevance for our children. We will be teaching English and Maths every day. Most of our English, including fiction and non-fiction genres will link to our topic. In Maths we are going to be learning Numbers and Counting, Calculation Strategies, Shape, Space and Measure and Data Handling. Where possible we will link this with our topic.

The children will also work with Ms Trula for Spanish on a Monday afternoon and will continue to have a P.E. session with Mr Bacon on a Monday and Thursday afternoon.

Reading Books:

Our reading scheme changed significantly last year and full information was sent out at the time. Please contact the school if you need another copy of this information. In line with the new scheme, children will be reading their accelerated reader books in class every day and given the opportunity to complete the quiz and change their book. The new reading record will be sent home this week and needs to be handed in each **Monday** for us to keep track of the children's

home reading. It seems that most pupils and parents are happy with administration of the new reading scheme but if you do have any concerns please do come in and see me. As a general reminder it is really important that the reading record is signed every week by an adult.

Homework:

Homework is set on a Monday and handed in the following Monday. For the first half term children will have a homework folder containing grammar and punctuation homework. This needs to be completed and handed in by the following Monday. As well as taking part in home reading activities five times a week, children also need to be practising their spellings in their spelling book for on average, 10 minutes a day, ready for the spelling test that will take place on a Tuesday. For maths, children need to practise the appropriate times table from the Times Table Adventure scheme which will also be tested on a Tuesday. Children who do not complete any part of the homework will as standard, bring home a letter informing you which part of their homework was not handed in. This is just to make sure you are aware. Any issues with homework, please know that you can always contact us to keep us

As last term, the children will have P.E. every **Monday** and **Thursday** with Mr. Bacon, our PE apprentice. **We ask for your child to have their P.E kit in school every day.**We would like to remind you that PE kit consists of:

- Tracksuits may be worn for outside PE during colder weather
- No earrings or jewellery to be worn for PE/swimming.
