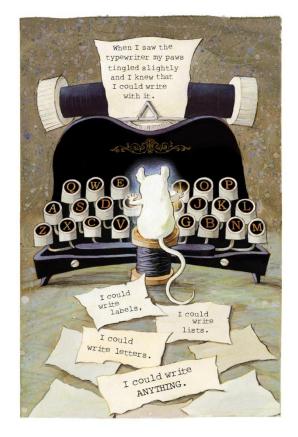

Year 2 National Curriculum Statements

Develop positive attitudes towards and stamina for writing by:

• writing for different purposes

Consider what they are going to write before beginning by:

- planning or saying out loud what they are going to write about
- writing down ideas and/or key words, including new vocabulary
- encapsulating what they want to say, sentence by sentence Make simple additions, revisions and corrections to their own writing by:
- evaluating their writing with the teacher and other pupils
- re-reading to check that their writing makes sense and that verbs to indicate time are used correctly and consistently, including verbs in the continuous form
- proof-reading to check for errors in spelling, grammar and punctuation [for example, ends of sentences punctuated correctly]
- read aloud what they have written with appropriate intonation to make the meaning clear.

Develop their understanding of the concepts set out in English Appendix 2 by:

 learning how to use both familiar and new punctuation correctly, including full stops, capital letters, exclamation marks, question marks, commas for lists and apostrophes for contracted forms and the possessive

Learn how to use:

- sentences with different forms: statement, question,
- expanded noun phrases to describe and specify
- the present and past tenses correctly
- subordination (using when, if, that, or because)
- co-ordination (using or, and, or but)
