Head teacher Weekly Update:

It has been lovely to see children, parents and staff after half term and interesting to hear about activities people did during the half term week.

On Monday, it was extremely exciting as our Minibus arrived! We are in the process of ensuring all documents for the use of the Minibus are completed, and getting quotes for it to have the school name and badge on it.

I would like to publicly thank the St Dennis and Nanpean Community Trust Fund for providing us with a Grant which has enabled us to purchase this, and we look forward to being able to use it from now on. The same fund has also provided us funding for a new set of Laptops, and our IT Technician is in the process of gaining quotes for this. We will then order and have a new set of Laptops for the children to use to go alongside the set of Laptops and iPads that we currently have.

On Tuesday and Wednesday mornings, I once again went around the school during Phonics sessions. I continually reiterate the importance of Phonics and Reading activities, as these sessions from 9 - 9.30am ensure children have the key skills related to Reading which underpin the Curriculum. It was a pleasure to see the children working alongside adults, and I always enjoy this time as it is clearly an enjoyable small group session for the children.

⇒ School Dinner Payments

Please can we ask that you login to ESchools on a regular basis and ensure that any outstanding payments for school dinners are settled frequently. If you are having difficulties logging in or are struggling to keep up with the payments please speak to the office.

\Rightarrow <u>Attendance</u>

Following advice from our Student Welfare Officer, and based on DfE guidelines, if your child has a headache or is feeling unwell, this is not a good enough reason for them to be off school. The suggestion is to give them some calpol, for example, and send them into school. Staff always monitor children and if we feel they are too unwell to be here, we will contact parents and ask you to collect children. As a result, we are also having to be much stricter with authorising absences, which may result in us asking for medical evidence. If this is provided, an absence can still be authorised, but if not it may have to be recorded as unauthorised.

\Rightarrow London Residential Trip

We can now confirm that we have sufficient numbers for the London residential trip to go ahead as planned. Thank you to all parents for ensuring permission and payment of the deposit by the deadline as we had to book by lunchtime on this day. We will be adding instalments on to ESchools for each child, to enable you to spread the cost and ensure that all payments are made before we need to pay the remainder of the cost for the trip.
