Football Matches against Foxhole

On Tuesday despite the bad weather that came in we went ahead with our matches against Foxhole.

"Well done to our Year 5/6 football team who enjoyed a close match with Foxhole. Both teams had some exceptional individual players but also played well as teams. We took an \Rightarrow early lead with a great goal from Charlie following Reuben's excellent pass. After this, we went in search of the second goal, but Foxhole hit us on the counter attack when we left gaps in our defence, and they scored two excellent goals, with Corey also making two superb saves. Foxhole then tried to defend their lead but Jake scored a late goal with an overhead kick which meant we drew the match 2-2". We made a strong start in the damp conditions and had lots of possession and good chances.
