#### $\Rightarrow$ School Council—The results are in...

A suggestion put to the School Council recently has been a change in school uniform to replace polo shirts with button down shirts and add a tie. This week our school councillors spoke to each class to gather their views regarding the uniform change. After listening to the school council the children casted their votes and the results are in: 119 pupils voted yes and 35 voted no. Although the idea has been popular with our pupils, we understand it may have more of an impact on parents/ carers than it would children. Therefore we are taking it to the next round: 'The parent vote!'. After half term, a letter will be sent home giving parents/ carers the chance to vote on the uniform changes. This will also give some more information on the practicalities of changing our uniform.

#### $\Rightarrow$ Safer Internet Day

Safer Internet Day 2017 was celebrated in school and globally on Tuesday 7th February with the theme 'Be the Change: Unite for a Better Internet'. The focus in KS2 was on 'The Power of Image', and the children took part in activities to encourage them to think carefully about the safety of sharing pictures online. We hope that this years Safer Internet Day has been educational and eye-opening to the young internet users in the school so that they can continue to stay safe and vigilant online. The message for KS1 pupils was 'Ask Before You Watch'. This should ensure that children ask parents/ carers for permission so that the content can be checked. There are several links to the work that the Rights Respecting School Group have been doing raising awareness of the articles in the UNCRC. As we know, children have the right to access information (Article 17), whether that be through print media, television or online. Children and young people are using the internet to learn, play and socialise more and more, so it is essential that children are empowered to take advantage of the many benefits the internet has in a safe and informed way, whilst respecting their right to privacy (Article 17) and their right to protection (Article 19).
