⇒ TIMES TABLE ADVENTURE

During the school year children from Year 2 to Year 6 will continue to take part in our Times Table Adventure. This scheme has been designed to motivate children to practise and learn their times tables at home.

It centres on a story about a princess who has lost the precious jewels from her magical ring. Each week the children will practise their allocated times table using a times table square that will be sent home with them by their teacher. They will then be tested on these times tables the following week by answering a series of questions about the times table within a 3 minute time limit. If the children get all of the answers correct, they will receive the next part of the story with the new times table square for the times table they need to practise.

The walking bus was a great success last term so we will continue to run the scheme. Letters have been sent out again this week for you to sign your child up to our Walking Bus for the Autumn term.

New Reading Records

This year we have designed and printed our own reading records. This will hopefully make it easier to keep a total of reading points for the Reading Challenge and to record the various reading activities that take place at home. There is a full explanation on the first page of the new reading record as well an 'example week' to explain how to use it.

Key Points:

· There is a new page for each week

· Fill in each reading activity that takes place at home during the week.

· Use the speech bubble to communicate any information that you wish to share about your child's reading.

• The school will fill in the 'Reading Points' every Monday. · The school will allocate Accelerated Reader bonus points for passing quizzes (if applicable).

Reading Challenge \Rightarrow

This year we will be continuing to reward children who engage in reading activities at home, with books! The Reading Challenge will follow exactly the same format as last year.

Reception and Year 1 and any other children not on **Accelerated Reader**

50 points— Certificate

100 points—Bookmark and certificate

150 points—Choose a book to keep from the school box and a certificate

200 points –Visit to a bookshop to choose own book to keep!

Year 2 and KS2

75 points—Certificate

150 points—Bookmark and certificate

225 points—Choose a book to keep from the school box and a certificate

300 points –Visit to a bookshop to choose own book (within a set price limit) to keep

2 bonus points for passing an AR quiz. 3 bonus points for passing a quiz and getting 100%.

The one change this year is that any of the following reading activities will count towards the Reading Challenge.

- 1. Read something electronically e.g. computer game, Kindle, etc.
- 2. Read a non-fiction text e.g. recipe, menu, etc.
- 3. Have someone read to you.
- 4. Read a comic or magazine.
- 5. Read anything in a place you have never read before.
- 6. Read my school book.

Only one activity per day will count towards the Reading Challenge. It is expected that your child engages with a reading activity at home 5 times a week in KS2 and 3 times a week in KS1.
