'FIRE ON FILM'

Fire on Film: Drinnick

Classroom will become a film studio and the children will be the producers, directors and cast of a film about the Great Fire of London. Through making the film, the children will learn about the timeline of events leading up to the fire, as well as learning about daily life in 17th Century Britain

Topic Launch: Pupils will make a trailer for the film in the first week of the topic.

English

Persuasive writing— Children will write a letter from the film production company, persuading the head-teacher to allow filming to take place on school grounds.

Adventure stories— Children will write an adventure story about fire. This story will be the story-board for the film.

Music

Pupils will use an app to create a sound track to their film.

Computing/e-safety

Children will be using a variety of ICT equipment and apps to produce their film. E-safety unit will be taught alongside, specifically covering 'digital self.'

Maths

We will use the topic as a platform to investigate multiplication and division problems, as well as perimeter and area of shape.

History

Children will learn about the timeline and events of the Great Fire as well as some background information about daily life in 17th Century Britain.

Science

Properties and changes of materials

Children will investigate the properties of different materials and look at how this could have been a factor during the Great
