Dear Parents/Carers,



Help! How did this happen? Somehow, we've arrived at the final term of our time together and, most importantly, your child's final term of primary school! Eleven school weeks might sound like a long time, but with a jam-packed schedule it's sure to fly by in a flash. This term there's everything from sailing to fish mummification! (Yes, you read that correctly.) Swimming starts tomorrow, but our sailing sessions begin during the second half of summer term on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> June.

<u>Our Summer Term Topic</u>: The topic for the whole of summer term is a career project based on the idea of exploring different job roles. The first part of term will focus on revision to help the children feel prepared for the May SATS and during the latter half we will tour a variety of careers chosen by Rosemellyn.



<u>SATS Week – Monday 13<sup>th</sup> May to Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> May Inclusive</u>: You will be aware from previous discussions surrounding SATS, that great emphasis is placed on the children achieving their own personal best rather than feeling pressure to pass a test. We do understand that, despite preparation, some children will still have concerns and as part of our revision we run sessions linked to self-esteem and resilience.

Attached to this letter is a leaflet that includes information such as the dates, the length of individual tests, what to do if your child is feeling unwell and when to expect the results. There is also a full timetable for the SATS week on our website. If you have any concerns or are aware of any reason that your child's attendance might be effected during that week, then please come to speak to Mrs Jago as soon as possible.



<u>Do you have an inspirational story</u>? Maybe your life choices lead you to a point where you had to be extremely resilient to achieve a personal goal? Was there an aspiration you had during Primary school that you went on to fulfil? We'd love to hear from you and believe that the stories that matter most, are the stories from the people closest to us. <u>Our Weekly Routine</u>: Continuing from last half term, we will not be studying Spanish with Ms Trula and these lessons will resume during the second half of Summer term. PE will continue to be on Monday afternoons with Mr Bacon and swimming sessions run every Wednesday.

**Homework** is still being set every **Friday** with an opportunity for children to speak with an adult from Rosemellyn for **support on Mondays** if they experience difficulties. After this point, all children are expected to hand in completed homework **every Wednesday**.

<u>Home Study</u>: To help prepare the children for the next stage of learning, there are weekly expectations for homework:

**Reading** = at least five (10 minute) sessions per week

**Spellings** = learning new words, but also revising previous word lists in order to retain them

**English** = a task consisting of approximately five questions or a specific activity

*Maths* = approximately five questions (sometimes with more than one part per question)

Mrs Jago will continue to make sure she is available during Monday break, if anyone in Rosemellyn would like extra help. Homework tasks that are not received will be completed in school, during their own time. Homework will be set from Friday 26<sup>th</sup> April.

Finally, although we are not due to formally meet again, please know that if you have any concerns or would like to speak to a Rosemellyn, just get in touch. We always welcome your feedback, especially during such an important final term.
