



### Discrete spelling lessons


- 1 'sc' for 's' (science and scene)

- 6 words with the /e1/ sound spelt ei, eigh, or ey









### Discrete spelling lessons

- 6 double consonant and add suffix e.g. forgotten, forgetting

- 7 words ending in 'le' 'el' 'al' 'ey' e.g. while, label, total, key


