SATs week for year 6 is approaching and Rosemellyn have been working hard all year in preparation. So that all children are confident they'll be able to do their best, it is vital that they attend school every day, especially during the week of the SATs themselves: Monday 14th May to Thursday 17th May. If your child is feeling unwell, but is not showing any signs of a contagious illness, please bring them into school and let a member of staff know. We will monitor them and send them home if needs be. So that children are able to focus on their SATS, please ensure that they get a good night's sleep and have a decent breakfast before coming to school. If your child is feeling worried or overly anxious about the SATS, please speak with Mrs Jago.

\Rightarrow KS1 SATs \sim w/c 21st May 2018

Leaflets were sent home last week informing parents of the SATs for the Year 2 children which will be taking place week commencing 21st May 2018. These are the National Curriculum tests for Reading and Maths. The children will take these tests in groups in Prosper classroom. We will not be reporting the marks children achieve in these tests and they simply help inform teacher assessment, which will be reported to parents in July. It is vital that all pupils are in school that week. Although, children should not be made to worry about these tests, please ensure that the children get plenty of sleep and eat a good breakfast every day so they are able to do their best, and please arrive promptly at 8:45am so that the children are ready to start on time.

Reading Challenge Reward

The top prize for our Reading Challenge this year is a visit to a bookshop to select their own book to keep. We can confirm that this prize will take place on the morning of Thursday 12th **July.** The children will be going to Waterstones in Truro. Once there, they will find out about the bookshop and the different departments and genres in the children section. They will also be helped to browse and select their own book to keep. Children not on Accelerated Reader need to reach 200 points and children on Accelerated Reader 300 points in order to be eligible for this prize. Children can earn points by reading at home (1 point per day) or by passing their AR quizzes (3 for 100%, 2 for passing). The children have until Monday 9th July when final point totals will be counted.

May Half Term Climbing Activities

Cornwall Outdoors has arranged for a series of climbing activities to take place for children aged 7 to 18 during the May Half Term Holiday. These activities can result in a Nationally recognised youth climbing qualification: Level 1 Foundation Climber (£56 for 3 half day sessions), and Level 2 Top Rope Climber for those with a foundation qualification (£75 for 4 half day sessions). These activities promote teamwork, hazard awareness, and movement skills in addition to learning climbing technique.
