

Year / Summer Term WORLD OF SENSES

In this unit the pupils will find out about the five senses and which part of the body each one of these senses is associated with. They will use these senses to explore their school grounds and create a sensory area for themselves.

Topic Launch: children to use their senses to make and taste a cream tea.

English

Spell the days of the week.

Spell words containing each of the 40+ phonemes taught.

Write sentences using full stops capital letters and finger spaces.

Listen to and discuss a wide range of poetry and non-fiction texts.

Participate in discussions presentations and performances.

Art/DT

Children to design and make a wooden spoon chime. Thinking about the colour and patterns.

Music

Listen, compare and contrast traditional UK and Indian music.

Make their own music using instruments to preform to the class.

Maths

Count in multiples of twos, fives and tens.

Solve one step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher.

Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

Geography

Identify the seven continents of the world.

Use world maps to identify where the UK is and India. Compare and contrast the different cultures thinking about our senses.

Go on senses walk using the compass and locational/directional language (near/far; left/right)

Science

Senses investigation—children to use their senses to guess what the object is make their predictions.

Computing/safety

Staying safe online.

Use Beebot to quide him though a maze.

Final Product: create a sensory trail for the class to enjoy.
