I have dealt with an issue this week which I was disgusted and very saddened by, due to how some children were commenting to another child. Luckily, this is extremely rare at Nanpean School as our children and families behave excellently and meet our high expectations. It has been dealt with this week with children and parents being spoken to where their children were involved, and a letter went to all parents in our Year 6 class. However, I politely encourage all parents to be vigilant where children are taking part in such activities to ensure the written content of messages or social media activity is appropriate and not upsetting to other children.

QUOTES FROM CHILDREN

<u>INSET DAYS FOR 2021-22 SCHOOL YEAR</u>

Around this time of year I always like to decide the INSET days for the following Academic year, and to therefore give plenty of notice to parents about these. The INSET days for 21-22 school year are as follows:

Monday 6th and Tuesday 7th September, 2021 (first two days of the Autumn Term).

Tuesday 4th January, 2022 (first day of the Spring Term).

Monday 25th April, 2022 (first day of the Summer Term).

Friday 10th June, 2022 (Royal Cornwall Show Friday). On these days, school is open for Staff, but is closed to children.
