HEAD TEACHER WEEKLY UPDATE

This week started with everyone dressed up in non-uniform as book characters for our World Book Day. This was moved from the original date as that clashed with Industrial Action taking place in schools, although Nanpean School wasn't affected by the 'strikes'. A reminder is included elsewhere on this Newsletter about the final two proposed days of industrial action which are due next week. Children enjoyed 'being off timetable' and dressing up as book characters on this day, and completed activities in relation to 'diversity', the theme chosen this year. The day started with Miss Morton's assembly about World Book Day, and a discussion about diversity, where children defined this during the assembly as 'celebrating how people are different to one another.' This was a wonderful day and thank you to Miss Morton for organising this.

On Tuesday, I took some members of our choir who are due to take place in SongFest to a rehearsal in Bodmin in the morning, then organised a 5-a-side indoor football tournament at Brannel in the afternoon. A report can be seen elsewhere on the Newsletter.

On Wednesday, we were due to return to Brannel for further sporting activities as defined on the Cluster Sports Calendar, for the Snell Cup (Football and High 5 Netball).
