<u>BOOK</u> <u>AMNESTY/SWAP</u> SHOP

If you have any books at home that your child has 'outgrown' and you would like to de-clutter your house, please bring any suitable books (for children or adults) to school on Friday 16th July. These will be quarantined over the weekend, and then will be sold, for a small donation that will go towards school funds, on Monday 19th July (weather permitting). Please ensure you are social distancing, wearing a face mask, and following Government guidance if you intend to look through the books. These will be located outside near the main entrance to the school office/ reception area.

<u>COVID 19 GUIDANCE</u>

This week, we have had to contact many parents to collect their children due to them coughing (for example) at school. We are well aware that coughs are not always Covid-19 related. However, we can't be sure of this, and as it is a possible symptom of

Covid-19, we need to follow Government guidance in relation to this, which states that children with any symptoms should isolate and book a PCR test as soon as possible. We want children to be at school, every day, progressing academically and socially with their friends. However, we also have a duty of care to other children, parents, staff and the local community, and when these phonecalls are made, we expect parents to cooperate in terms of health and safety, not to be angry or question staff, and collect their children as quickly as possible.

<u>INSET DAYS</u>

Just to remind you, as per the last Newsletter, that around this time of year I always like to decide the INSET days for the following Academic year, and to therefore give plenty of notice to parents about these. The INSET days for 21-22 school year are as follows: Monday 6th and Tuesday 7th September, 2021 (first two days of the Autumn Term). Tuesday 4th January, 2022 (first day of the Spring Term). Monday 25th April, 2022 (first day of the Summer Term). Friday 10th June, 2022 (Royal Cornwall Show Friday). Monday 13th June, 2022 (extra day for school staff due to Bank Holiday for the Platinum Jubilee). On these days, school is open

for Staff, but is closed to children.

SPORTS DAY

As you will be aware from text messages sent on Sunday evening from our eschools system, Sports Day was cancelled on Monday due to the weather. This has now been rearranged for this coming Monday, the 5th of July. Again, children can attend in their PE Kit on this day. Due to Covid-19 related guidelines and in liaison with other local schools so we are all consistent with our approach, this year parents are not invited to our sports day as we usually have so many people attending that social distancing guidelines would be impossible to follow. I understand that parents enjoy seeing their children take part in sports day and similar events, but I hope you appreciate that this is for the safety of everyone at school and the local community.

Please ensure you are social distancing, wearing a face mask, and following Government guidance if you intend to look through the uniform available. These will be located outside near the main entrance to the school office/ reception area.
