\Rightarrow <u>Sailing at Polkerris</u>

Letters were sent home last week informing parents/ carers that children in year 5 and 6 have been offered the opportunity to learn to sail. This will be financed by the Roseland Youth Sailing Trust and so there is no charge for these lessons, but if you have not already returned your child's consent form, this must be done by Tuesday 23rd April, or your child will not be able to attend these sessions. If you have not received a copy of this consent form, please contact the office. Children will need to bring a swimming kit, towel (separately to your child's swimming kit to be used for swimming lessons on Wednesday afternoons), and shoes that are able to get wet. This can be trainers, aqua shoes or wetsuit boots. Other equipment will be provided by Polkerris Sailing Club.

\Rightarrow Book Fair

Our Book Fair will be arriving on **Thursday 25th April and will stay until Wednesday 1st May**. The Fair will be open after school until 4pm for everyone to come in and look at the books available. Each class will have the opportunity to look at the book fair during the school day and complete a wish list, which will be sent home with the children. Parents/ carers can then either come in and purchase a book or you can send the money into school in a named envelope with the correct money with your child. All books purchased will equate to more books for the school. Consequently, we will no longer be supplying tuck for break times. Please ensure your child brings their own healthy snack from home.

Also, no visitor to the school (including parents/ carers) should park in the school car park without express consent from the head teacher.







Boxercise/ Circuits at Nanpean Community Hall

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There will be some introductory fitness sessions taking place from Thursday 25th April in our Community Hall. There will be two sessions running: from 4pm to 5pm for parents/ carers with children of primary school age, and from 5.30pm to 6.30pm for anyone who is secondary school age and up.
