Parent Questionnaire Feedback

Thank you to all of you who took the time to complete our questionnaire at this year's Spring Term Parent's Evening. All of your views were collated and the feedback was sent home in book bags this week. We had overwhelmingly positive feedback again this year; with our learning environment, the children's progress and positive attitudes towards their learning, our high aspirations for our pupils and the instilling of these values into our pupils being particular aspects we are doing well and we are pleased to report that parents feel communication between school and home is improving. This is wonderful for us to hear and we will continue in doing all these positive things. We also had some suggestions where we could improve and all of these ideas will be taken into consideration in the future development of the school. Anti-Bullying

On our parent questionnaire a few parents answered 'Don't Know' to 'The School deals effectively with bullying'. Therefore, we wanted to draw your attention to how cases of bullying are dealt with at Nanpean School. Bullying is defined as repeated hurtful or aggressive behaviour with the intention to cause emotional or physical harm to another person, and it is not tolerated, in any form, at our school. We are committed to the creation of a positive and safe learning environment for all. Although we have a zero-tolerance approach to bullying, we are also proactive in preventing bullying taking place in the first place. This is done by implementing our Behaviour and Discipline Policy for incidents of hurtful or aggressive behaviour in any form to prevent recurrence and through our Protective Behaviour assemblies, which encourage children to keep themselves and each other safe. However, if bullying does occur our behaviour and discipline policy will be followed and staff will gather evidence, with support from the Senior Leadership Team. Parents of those involved will be kept informed at all stages. If it is a serious incident, temporary or permanent exclusion will be considered after a full review of the facts.
