

Hendra—Kristopher Kessell for super concentration and determination with his handwriting.


Prosper— Blake Hazell for his brilliant understanding and contributions to topic discussion about Castles.

Rosemellyn class (Year 6) are off to Brannel School on Tuesday 14th November and will be based in their 'Create Wing'; the students will sample the various exciting and stimulating Design and Technology based activities that are on offer at the school. On this day, students will be transported from Nanpean School to Brannel School by coach and will return in time for the end of their normal school day. They will be accompanied by a staff member of Rosemellyn class and will work closely alongside Brannel staff. Students will also have the opportunity to experience parts of everyday life at Brannel and will be able to use the cafeteria areas for break and lunch. Food will be provided on this day by Brannel's 'In House' catering services. However, if your child has any particular food requirements, please feel free to provide them with a packed lunch, which they will be able to eat with the other students. This Transition Day is part of a wider package of visits and events that proved most rewarding for students last year.
