LUNCHTIME AWARD


Each week we present a child with a Lunchtime Award. This is to recognise and reward a child who has been notably kind, helpful or well behaved during lunchtimes for the week.

<u>St Johns Ambulance First Aid Training written by **Zoe Gardner** (**Drinnick**):</u>

On Wednesday, Sue taught us DRABC which means Danger, Response, Airway, Breathing and Call for help. We got into partners and did DRABC. First we checked for danger, then we were talking and tapping on their shoulder to get a response. We then put two fingers on their chin and five on their forehead and checked whether they were breathing. We then put their foot on the floor and knee in the air and put their hand on the floor ready for a high five. Next we put their glasses in their hand and their hand furthest away onto their cheek and rolled them over. Finally we called for help.

Thank you to St Johns Ambulance for taking the time to come \Rightarrow into school and teach our year 3, 4 and 5 pupils some basic first aid skills.
