\Rightarrow <u>Healthy Tuck</u>

As a proud Healthy School, we are now going to insist on children only having fruit or vegetables (such as carrot sticks) for their tuck during playtime from Monday to Thursday. We will not be permitting dried fruit or cereal bars, as many of these are processed and contain high sugar content. However, in order to teach children about a Balanced Diet, and that it is ok to have the occasional treat, we will be allowing 'Treat Friday' where the children can bring a small treat (e.g. small chocolate bar/crisps) for tuck.

 Our School Improvement Priorities are as follows:

Improving the percentage (%) of children reaching the expected standard in all 3 of the assessed subjects (Reading, Writing, Maths).

Focus on ensuring that children develop basic skills, especially Reading, as this underpins the whole Curriculum and promotes lifelong learning.

Ensuring all children are mentally healthy (Wellbeing).

Inspiring children, through providing a variety of opportunities, to have high aspirations.

Whole school attendance and that of individual children to be above the national expectation of 96%.

Engaging parents through social media and to support their child's learning.
