Thursday 18th May is Census day! On this day, we are required to report key data to the Local Authority for the purposes of determining our school funding and for statistical analysis. Pupil Premium funding (additional funding to be used solely for the purpose of educating children who meet set criteria, including being from low income families) is determined from our school census. Pupils, in any year group, who are in receipt of Free School Meals will have this additional funding. Please ensure that you apply before Thursday 18th May so that your child can benefit from this funding as soon as possible.
