#### Children in Need ~ 18/11/2016

This year Children in Need is taking place on **Friday 18th November**. We will be having a **non-school uniform** day with a **spotacular polka dot theme** for a £1 donation to Children in Need. Most excitingly we will be running a sponsored spot challenge circuit throughout the day that all children can be sponsored to take part in. Danielle Rouse will join us for the day as a Teaching Assistant. As this day will also be Children in Need, the new teachers will watch a session being lead and will run the following sessions. We look forward to welcoming the students back to the school for their student takeover day, and can't wait to find out what sort of teachers they will make.

#### ⇒ Parking and Road Safety

As the weather turns colder and more miserable, we see an increase in the number of people driving their children to school. Please can all families respect our neighbours and park sensibly. Unfortunately some of the residents have had their driveways blocked or have been blocked in on the road. We understand that parking at school times can be difficult but that is not our neighbours' fault. The zig zag lines outside of school must be kept clear at all times, and no parents should be driving on to the school site either to park or to turn around in the interests of pedestrian safety. It is also very important that pedestrians do their best to contribute to keeping themselves safe. This means that children who are collected at the end of the day should be accompanied home, not allowed to run off or around the school/ church rooms car park. Parking is manic enough at the end of the day without drivers having to worry about dodging unsupervised children. Once children have been released to authorised adults at the end of the day, they become that adults responsibility but we will take any reports that a child has been allowed to place him or herself in danger seriously.

#### So you want to be an Archaeologist Workshops

Our children have been enjoying their visits to Brannel to do Archaeology workshops. In the first session, the children participated in a dinosaur workshop; digging for fossils and analysing dinosaur bones. The second session had a bronze age focus. An archaeologist from Exeter University visited the students and brought a (replica) bronze age sword with him! The children got to look at ancient archaeological finds and ask the archaeologist questions about his favourite thing about archaeology. Here's what they thought of the sessions:
