HEAD TEACHER WEEKLY UPDATE

Welcome back after the half term break, which I hope you all enjoyed. It was lovely to see all the children back at school and smiling with friends this week. On Monday morning, I visited each class to welcome them back to school, and it was delightful to see how settled and productive the children already were following their week off. On Tuesday, I met with Miss Morrison and Class Teachers about Provision Mapping. This is where we discuss children's progress and Teachers are able to highlight positives as well as any concerns. The positives are of course celebrated, and the concerns are noted so that they are monitored, and if the concerns continue, we then endeavour in future to provide further support for these children, often through interventions, when spaces are available.

On Thursday I enjoyed working with Mr Tonkin to monitor Maths teaching and learning throughout the school. Maths was praised in our recent OfSTED inspection, and Mr Tonkin and I were able to highlight positives as well as further areas for improvement.

At the time of writing (Thursday evening) I am looking forward to teaching French as part of our Modern Foreign Languages (MFL) provision to Years 3 to 6 tomorrow afternoon. I have been delighted with how the children have responded to these sessions and their French language learning thus far this academic year.

As you will see on the final page of today's Newsletter, there is further information about Covid-19 as, from Monday (8th November), we will be reverting to class bubbles for safety within the community. I profusely apologise that this impacts things such as extra-curricular 'clubs', but I hope you understand that this ensures we minimise contact between children in different class bubbles.

If your child has 2 class teachers, only one of the teachers will show when you are trying to book, please do not worry, both of your child's teachers will join the virtual meeting.

COVID 19 AND CLUBS UPDATE

As always, we have been keeping a close eye on the number of Covid cases in the local community and within the school. Although we have had very few children who have a confirmed Covid test result, we are now hearing that the rates in the local community (including parents of the school) are getting to a dangerous level. As a result of this, with effect from Monday (8th November) we will be re-introducing the 'bubble' system within the school. This means there will be no mixing between year groups at any time within the school day, especially indoors. This will also mean all extra-curricular clubs will be cancelled. At present, we will NOT be re-introducing the staggered drop off and collection times. However, we urge parents to be proactive and think of their own safety and that of the community, and we would prefer parents to wear facemasks on the school premises. As many of you will be aware, such things have been put in place at other schools, and we are aware that some other schools have had to close class bubbles or year groups.

We do understand this will be a disappointment to some, however, we feel we are taking the necessary precautions to protect both our staff, our pupils and the community to hopefully avoid closure of the school if cases continue to rise as they are.

We hope these measures are only needed for a short period of time, but will continue to monitor the situation and will continue to rapidly communicate any further information as we get it.
