Outcomes

- ✓ In EYFS, the school average for Communication and Language was 2.1 (85% at age-related expectations) with 15% on a SALT care plan.
- ✓ In EYFS, 0% of Pupil Premium pupils achieved a GLD, mainly due to additional and complex needs.
- ✓ In Year 1, 63% of all pupils passed the phonics screening check (81% national, 2016); 80% of PP pupils passed (70% PP national, 2016).
- ✓ In Year 2, 60% of PP pupils met the expected standard in reading, writing and maths combined, compared to 69% of all pupils.
- ✓ In Year 2, 20% of PP pupils exceeded the expected standard in reading, writing and maths combined, compared to 8% of all pupils.
- ✓ In Year 2, PP pupils performed better than non-PP pupils in maths.
- ✓ In Year 6, 57% of PP pupils had special educational needs.
- ✓ Persistent absenteeism decreased from 8 pupils (2015/16) to 6 pupils (2016/17).
- ✓ 3 PP pupils had persistent absence (>10%) in 2016/17; x2 due to medical needs and x1 due to housing crisis and relocation.
- ✓ Unauthorised Absence decreased from 0.73% (2015/16) to 0.58% (2016/17).
