⇒ Children in Need ~ Friday 16th November

Nanpean School will be taking part in Children in Need on **Friday 16th November**. The theme of the day is 'Do Your Thing'. Children are free to come into school wearing whatever fancy dress or non-school uniform they want! We are asking for a £1 donation from each pupil for the dress up day, which will go towards our Children in Need fundraising efforts. This year we are also inspired by Team Rickshaw: Each child and staff member will Freestyle a mile to collectively complete the distance equivalent to the Cornish Coastline—A massive 296 miles! Children can skip, hop, walk, or use any other manner of moving for their mile. We will also allow children to scoot their mile if they wish. If they choose to complete their mile on a scooter, however, they must bring in their own scooter and an acceptable safety helmet. For safety and storage reasons, we will only allow scooters to be brought in from home; not a variety of equipment. This endeavour will be a sponsored challenge and so children will be taking home a sponsorship form in due course to raise some additional money for Children in Need if they wish to. All money raised by Nanpean School will be donated to the Children in Need fundraising effort.
