\Rightarrow Key Stage 1 Nativity

On Tuesday 12th December and Wednesday 13th December, Key Stage 1 children (those in Reception, Year 1 and 2) will be performing this year's Nativity: A Wriggly Nativity. Tickets, including additionally requested tickets, have all been sent home. We still have a small number of tickets available for the performance on Wednesday 13th December at 2pm. Please note that siblings/children under primary school age will not be permitted at the 5.30pm performance on Tuesday 12th December or the 2pm performance on Wednesday 13th December. We have arranged a special performance for younger children to attend on Tuesday 12th December at 2pm, and tickets are still available for this performance too. Please contact the office if you would like to request any additional tickets for these performances. Entry for all performances will be via the main hall doors. For the 5:30pm performance on Tuesday 12th December, please can children be dropped off at their normal class entrances at 5pm, so that they can get changed and ready for their performance. Children will then need to be collected from their normal class exits after the performance. All of our KS1 pupils have been putting a lot of effort and practice into their performances, and we can't wait to see it!

⇒ Non School Uniform Day ~ 15/12/17

We will be having a Christmas themed non school uniform day on **Friday 15th December** and we ask in return that parents/ carers donate boxes of mince pies, prizes, cakes or baked goods, or £1 towards the cost of running the Fair. We will be accepting donations at any point from now until the morning of the Fair and will be grateful for any and all contributions.

⇒ <u>Christmas Fair ~ 18/12/17</u>

Our Christmas Fair will be taking place on Monday 18th December from 1.30pm. Class teachers will release all children from usual end of day exits to permitted adults at 1.20pm. Please note that children who are on our unaccompanied list, will not be released until 3.10pm unless they are collected by an adult. The Hall doors will open for the Fair at 1.30pm. Children not collected at 1.20pm will be supervised by school staff in Karslake classroom, so if you are running late, please walk around to the Year 3 classroom to collect your child. These children will still have the opportunity to visit the Fair, in small groups under the supervision of school staff. Once you have collected your child from the classroom at 1.20pm, staff will no longer be responsible for your child, and so you are free to leave once you have browsed the Fair. We will have face painting, glitter tattoos, stocking and decoration decorating, raffles, tombola, other games and competitions, and Santa's grotto. We will be selling Nanpean Calendars throughout next week, for collection at the Fair, and are hoping to make school tea towels available for pre-order at the Fair. All children have contributed to the creation of these items and they make lovely, useful keepsakes. Calendars can be preordered by either school entrance and in reception. There will be small number of additional calendars available at the Fair, but so that we have an idea of numbers, please do take the time to request yours in advance. We will be running the teddy bear stall this year, and so if you have any teddies at home that are in good condition but need a new home, please drop them into the office. If you would like to run your own stall at our Fair, please let Miss Dash or Mrs Wicks know. We charge £5 per stall, payable in advance of the Fair, and you get to keep your profits. Again, we ask if anyone can help with the prepping or setting up of the Fair.

⇒ Brighter Smiles Initiative

Nanpean School has approached Brighter Smiles to assist us as part of our commitment to the health and wellbeing of our pupils. Brighter Smiles is a campaign set up be the Smile Together Dental Community Interest Company; Cornwall's leading providers of emergency and access dental care. The campaign has been launched as a response to the fact that more children in Cornwall need to be hospitalised and require a general anaesthetic for tooth extraction than for any other reason. 20 children a week currently go into hospital for teeth extractions, missing on average at least 4 school days, that could have been prevented through education. This campaign involves Brighter Smiles working closely with our school to educate our pupils on the importance of correct dental hygiene and provides a dental nurse service across the year. We will be able to provide more information on this collaborative project in due course.
