Notes of meeting	Action	
Last meeting - actions Class Trips to local places to walk and appreciate surroundings – will try to do more educational visits in future (minibus). More charitable events (i.e. Shoebox appeal) – aiming for one per half term, School Council to decide. Uniform exchange / swap shop – we aim to do these once per term (hindered by lockdowns but one is taking place next week). A veggie week every so often or improve veggie options – MN has spoken to Caterlink.		
1) Return to School Parents agreed this had been successful and the use of different entrances (with Teachers greeting on doors and TA's welcoming children in classrooms) is successful in keeping people apart (generally) and also allows parents time to talk to Teachers if required. Parents were unanimously positive about this approach. However, they did feel that three classes (Years 4, 5, 6) in one security gate does get quite busy. Some parents felt that all parents should be enforced to wear a mask on the school site. Others disagreed, and MN said that as it isn't a Government guideline now, he can't enforce this. Parents understood this. All parents agreed that it has mainly been successful as the children are all extremely happy. They gave many reasons for this. been a huge positive. MN explained that previously, not all parents had been positive about this, but we will try to ensure children look smart.
