Head teacher Weekly Update:

It has been an enjoyable week this week and I have visited all classrooms on numerous occasions. I enjoyed visiting Eden class on a couple of occasions and hearing about their number blocks and learning about zoo animals. They were all extremely excited to be learning through play as is common in this class. I also enjoyed visiting Years 2 (Prosper) and 6 (Rosemellyn) during their Healthy Relationships sessions. It was interesting to hear Year 2 talking about secrets and 'safe' secrets, with 'safe' secrets being those that are acceptable to keep, such as surprise parties, whereas other secrets may be things that need to be shared with others for a specific reason. Year 2 children also completed a hand of named people that they trust, thankfully myself and other members of staff were included on many of these! Year 6 were having a very interesting conversation about gender stereotypes and how these are portrayed in the media when I visited them.

I also enjoyed visiting Year 3 (Karslake) during one of their lessons this week when the focus was multiplication (times) tables. I enjoyed seeing them playing some games and improving the speed of their mental recall. I am focusing on this as well to ensure I am ready for any Head to Head challenges I may receive during Achievement Assembly on Friday mornings!

Finally, I enjoyed visiting Year 5 (Drinnick) class as they had made Greek Clay Pots with Mrs Williams. These looked excellent and I know the children are now excited about decorating them further when they paint them.

I have also had a meeting with staff from Cornwall Council about ongoing issues such as the water in the car park. These are in hand and being focused on, but this is a long process. However, hopefully these issues will be rectified soon. In the meantime, we apologies for any inconvenience and please be careful around this area.

⇒ KS2 Swimming

Swimming for years 3 to 6 will be commencing on WEDNESDAYS after the Easter Holidays. Letters with further information are attached to this newsletter. The first session will be **Wednesday 24th April**. Children will be having their lessons at the Dragon Leisure Centre in Bodmin as this pool gave us the opportunity to split swimming sessions so each child could get more out of their lessons. We are asking for a £3 voluntary donation from parents/ carers per week, which can be paid through ePay. Please do not send cash into the office.

⇒ Correct School Uniform

A quick reminder about our expectations for school uniform. Children should wear a red jumper or cardigan (this can be with or without our school logo), a white polo shirt, black or grey trousers, skirt or shorts, and sensible black shoes (not trainers). We appreciate that there can be exceptional reasons as to why a child cannot adhere to this for a day, and appreciate where parents/ carers make us aware of this. However, we will be raising persistent incorrect uniform with parents/ carers to ensure our pupils can represent our school as best as they can.

⇒ School Gates and Site Security

There have been reports of parents/ carers or family members being on site very early for either dropping children off or collecting them. Part of our safeguarding assessment includes having a secure site and knowing who is on our site at which times, especially where children could be outside doing P.E or where parents/ carers wait in a place that could be disruptive to pupils' learning. We will be working closely with Nanpean Nippers to ensure our site is secure for all children and ask that all visitors to our site respect the measures we have put in place. The school gates will be open for school drop off and collection at the following times:

At 8.40am to 9am for general school drop off. At 3pm to 3.20pm for general school collection. At 3.55pm for collection from clubs.

If you see the gates open outside of these times, please report this immediately to the Office. Any adults seen on school ground outside of these times, unless expressly permitted by the relevant school staff will be asked to leave in accordance with our school procedures.
