HEAD TEACHER WEEKLY UPDATE

As always, much of my week this week has been spent working alongside other professionals to consider how to best support the children at Nanpean School. This has been in relation to bespoke support for individuals, where required, and has also involved virtual meetings with other Headteachers where we have discussed a variety of topics in relation to the current situation and ongoing school improvement.

This week, I have again enjoyed visiting and hearing groups taking part in Phonics sessions. Mrs Hayes (our RWI Phonics Leader) has also been reassessing the children to ensure they are in appropriate groups after half term. We are delighted with the progress being made by the children in these groups.

Finally, I have been made aware this week that some other local schools have had confirmed cases of Covid-19. We are doing our utmost to follow the guidance in the hope that this doesn't happen. If this does happen, in liaison with Public Health England and the Local Authority, the plan of action will be communicated to parents and our school community. Thank-you for your cooperation, I hope you have a lovely, relaxing weekend. Best wishes to you all and your families,



PARKING

<u>SPEED LIMIT</u>

I had previously written to

parents to explain that we expected speed restrictions to be put in place on the road outside school (St George's Road) over the Summer Holidays. This was delayed due to the current situation (Covid-19). However, we now expect this to happen over half term (week beginning Monday 26th October). This is something that I have supported and investigated for a significant amount of time, and hopefully this also improves safety in the local area.

This is because currently Government guidelines don't allow for visiting houses to 'trick or treat', so I wanted the children to be able to experience dressing in costume in a safe environment. MORNING ENTRY

Thankfully in these difficult times, the vast majority of children are always on time entering school each morning. However, when children are late, please see Mr Nicholls outside and he will explain the process which will involve waiting until the specified entrance is clear. If for any reason Mr Nicholls is unavailable, please take your child to the side window of Reception and Mrs Houston / Miss Pascoe will be available to support. This is a polite reminder to explain, as we need to have such processes in order to ensure the safety of everyone as children can't mix with other bubbles / classes.
