A reminder to parents that the school starts promptly at 9am. Doors are open for children to come in at **8:45am.** Please can parents ensure that they arrive before 9am as the security gate and doors will shut when the second bell rings. We appreciate that it is very occasionally unavoidable that children will be late, but it is important that children are in school on time to limit disruption to the child, their class and staff. KS1 children should not be left unaccompanied until they have entered the school and KS2 children who are unable to wait sensibly must also be accompanied by an adult until the doors open.
