2. Year 4 Reading Resources

You could look for a text that feels right for your child on Twinkl by searching for reading comprehension resources for Year 4 and for LKS2 (Lower Key Stage 2). Several resources are split up into what looks like 3 sets of the same thing. However, if you look around the edge of some of the sheets, you might see either 1 star (an easier version of the text and questions), 2 stars (slightly harder) or even 3 stars (the hardest version). The stars don't appear on all the resources, sometimes there is only 1 version of the text together with 1 set of reading comprehension questions.

- 3. Practise your spellings as often as possible using your login for the following site:


