Winter Illnesses

There has been a lot of media coverage lately about Aussie Flu. With this in mind, we wanted to remind you of some tips to avoid catching any winter bugs:

Census Day ~ 18/01/2018

Thursday 18th January is our next school census day. The census is the basis upon which the school receives its funding and this includes funding for the free school dinners for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. If your children tend to have school meals, please ensure that they have one on this day so that our funding will be accurate. Also, we sent home information about the Pupil Premium funding available to those in specific circumstances at the end of last term. If your child meets the criteria set, please either complete the application form and send it back to school or apply directly for this funding using the Cornwall Council website. This funding is for your child's education and has many other benefits, such as free school meals, free music lessons, and discounts on school trips. Please make this application by Monday 15th January to ensure that your child gets funding as soon as possible.

⇒ <u>Uniform Expectations</u>

Please ensure that your child comes to school in the correct school uniform. Our school uniform consists of: a red school jumper/ cardigan, a white polo shirt, black trousers/ skirt, and black school shoes. Many children have been wearing all sorts of different shoes and boots. We appreciate that sometimes in an emergency, your child's school shoes or uniform will be damaged or unwearable, but please call and let us know this. Otherwise, we will expect to see all children in sensible black school shoes. Also, PE kits should be kept in school all week.
