HEAD TEACHER WEEKLY UPDATE

I hope that you have all had a lovely Summer and have enjoyed the beginning of the 2022-23 academic year at Nanpean School. It has been lovely to welcome the children back, and speak to children (and some parents) about things they did during the Summer. It has also been lovely to visit children in their classrooms to see the excitement and enthusiasm they are showing as they begin work in various different curriculum subjects for this term.

Last week, you will have hopefully seen the letter sent on Friday about the proposal for Nanpean School to convert to Academy status and join Truro and Penwith Academy Trust (TPAT). On this letter, there are a few days and times where parents can attend a meeting to find out more. This is something that the Governing Board have been considering for a long time, but has now happened following the Government announcement that they expect all schools to become Academies. As a result, we have

researched various Multi Academy Trusts, and feel that TPAT are the most appropriate trust for Nanpean School. This is because they are very supportive, but allow us, as Nanpean School, to retain autonomy, and don't force us to make changes (for example to school name, uniform, etc...) I hope you agree that this is a sensible decision for the future of Nanpean School.

On Monday, Curriculum Learning Maps, showing coverage in subjects for this term, were sent home via Class Dojo and Tapestry. I always enjoy reading these and I hope that family members find them useful to know about their child's learning.

On Tuesday, we (Year 6) attended their first weekly sailing session which will run until the centre closes at October Half Term.

On Wednesday, I enjoyed meeting Miss Morton about school priorities for further improvement, and we also completed our first Monitoring of the school year. It was lovely to visit all classrooms and see the children in their new learning environment.

On Thursday, I met with representatives from the Youth Sport Trust about an initiative to support wellbeing, and I also met Anne Bullock, one of our Governors, who visited school and completed some Monitoring as planned on our Governor Monitoring Schedule.

As I write this (Thursday evening), I am looking forward to teaching French to Years 3-6 tomorrow (Friday) afternoon, which will be my first session with them for this academic year.
