<b>1) Policies</b> MN shared Policies with the parents as these are about to be renewed and MN said that parental input on some policies is always helpful. Parents stated that these policies were excellent and useful information for parents.	Policies to be shared (and renewed) with Governors.
<b>2) Reflection sheets</b> MN explained that Behaviour at Nanpean School is generally very good. However, we have a clear Behaviour Policy and adjustments are made when appropriate (relevant to the needs of children). MN explained that the 'Time to Think' sheets were old, out of date, and not having the desired impact anymore, so MN has done some research and changed these so that they are more about consequences. MN asked for parents opinions. Parents liked the new sheets and the reasons behind these related to consequences.	MN to share with children and parents via assembly and Class Dojo. These will be used from Monday 31 <sup>st</sup> January, 2022.
<b>3) AOB</b> The only AOB this week was parents from one class asking if further support could be put in place due to 'the high level of need' in the class (in their words). MN explained that he understands their viewpoint, but that all classes have a high level of need, and this has been exaggerated following Covid-19, but that we provide as much support as is possible with the funding received from Government. MN then explained that funding is low, and all schools are in a similar situation, and some schools don't have TA's for afternoons. The parents then asked if gaining EHCP's for some children would help. MN explained that this is a long process, and that it is very difficult for EHCP's to be granted nowadays, whereas it seemed easier previously. Parents understood this and thanked MN, saying they are aware everyone is working hard, trying their best, and that the children are all extremely happy at Nanpean School.
