#### **School Dinners**

Please can parents ensure that any outstanding school dinners are paid for as soon as possible, preferably by the end of term. Free school meals forms were sent home last week, if you meet the eligibility criteria please ensure you return completed forms to the office. A reminder that children in Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) automatically qualify for free school meals, children in Key Stage 2 (Years 3, 4, 5 and 6) need to apply for them if you are eligible. Anyone that doesn't qualify , the cost is £2.30 a day, to be paid through Eschools.

## **Healthy Tuck**

As a proud Healthy School, next year (from September), we are going to insist on children only having fruit for their tuck during playtime. The fruit needs to be a piece of fruit, not dried fruit or cereal bars, as much of this is processed and contains high sugar content. However, in order to teach children about a Healthy Balanced Diet, and that it is ok to have the occasional treat, fruit only is allowed on a Monday - Thursday, and we will then have 'Treat Friday' where the children can bring a small chocolate bar for their tuck.
