Please could we remind parents / carers that children should not be dropped off early at school, they should only be on the premises from 8:45am, unless alternative arrangements have been agreed to by the head teacher. We do not have the staff available to supervise the children if they are in school so early in the mornings which then becomes a safeguarding issue. Please note that unless they are registered on our unaccompanied list, no child should be left without adult supervision before school begins.

\Rightarrow <u>Absence Reporting</u>

We would like to remind parents / carers of the importance of contacting the office on the first day of a child's absence to inform us that your child will not be in school that day. The office and the telephones in school are only staffed from 8:15am so when calling to report your child's absence / illness could you please call after this time.

\Rightarrow Year 6 Trip to the Recycling Facility

On Thursday, Rosemellyn visited the St. Dennis Recycling Centre. Polina has brilliantly summed up the day for us: *"It* was an amazing day! First things first, as soon as we got off the bus we realised how HUGE the centre was! We had a short presentation; letting us understand what can and cannot be recycled.
