⇒ Sports Day 2018 ~11/06/2018

Monday 11th June is our first attempt at Sports Day. Parents and families are welcome to join us for our afternoon of races that begin at 1:30pm. Our Year 2 pupils have been amazing this week as they sat their end of KS1 tests. All their hard work paid off as the children remained focussed and positive. The marks children achieve in these tests are used to help inform teacher assessment, reported to parents in July.

⇒ New reading-at-home scheme in Drinnick Class

⇒ Stay Safe

Year 6 children have been taking part in a series of workshops run by *Stay Safe*. Two of our Year 6 children wrote the following statements about the workshops: 'On Monday and Wednesday we had a visitor from 'Stay Safe' to learn about different ways and tips for staying safe. They talked about how to deal with bullying and what to do if a stranger comes near and how you ask someone for help.'

⇒ School Council visit

Our school council had the privilege of heading to St Stephen in Brannel Parish Council offices (on a double decker bus!) on Wednesday to observe a Youth Council session take place. The Youth Council are a group of students of all year groups from Brannel School. Some interesting points we learnt were: their meeting was run very formally, their agenda was full of advanced vocabulary, the chairmen was very confident at running their meetings, and the parish council clerk does their paperwork. One of the topics they discuss was 'highways' and we were informed that speed guns can no longer be used by children due to health and safety issues. We also learnt a new word: 'dispensations' means exemption from a rule. It is hoped that, in the future, members of the Youth Council will join us to support our school council.
