### **HEAD TEACHER WEEKLY UP**

This week has been an intense and busy week as always, although I am delighted that Parent Consultations, using the School Cloud system for virtual meetings, generally went well on Tuesday and Wednesday, as this had been something I was worried about.

Before I give details about this week, I just wanted to remind parents that at the end of last week, I had an attendance monitoring meeting with Caroline Hunt, the Student Welfare Officer (SWO). Despite being affected by Covid-19, our attendance remains high, and certainly higher than most schools. However, where we have concerns, either about attendance or punctuality (regular lateness when arriving to school) these are communicated to parents as per our attendance policy through formal letters. These have gone to parents this week, where required, so I hope to see improvement in attendance and punctuality where this is required.

On Monday I had many meetings. On Tuesday and Wednesday, I was extremely anxious about School Cloud' (the online system being used for Parent Consultation appointments). However, these' virtual meetings generally ran smoothly and parents were informed about their child's progress and future targets. Just a reminder that if you do ever need to talk to your child's class teacher, they are available each morning from 8.45 - 9am, but they do have to leave promptly at 9am to teach the class.

The paper copies, which include targets, that are discussed during these Parent Consultation appointments are being sent home today with your child.

On Thursday and Friday, we welcomed Richard Pomfrett to our school. Each year, he visits classes in relation to 'staying safe'. This year, both Year 5 and Year 6 attended. The children enjoyed his workshops and clearly learnt a lot from them.

Once again, I would also like to politely remind you all that Covid-19 is still prevalent in the A date for your diaries, the next community as it is all over the world. We returned to bubbles because of cases within the community, and this week I am aware that the Prime Minister has again said that 'he can't rule out another lockdown'. I really hope this doesn't happen, as I immensely enjoyed some 'normality' returning to schools from September, but, as always, decisions are made to ensure the safety of children, their parents, our staff and the whole community. On this note, although I can not enforce it in school, I would politely urge parents to wear a face mask on the school site and thank you for your cooperation with this.

I am writing to introduce you to our Healthy Relationships Programme (HRP) which we deliver in partnership with First Light as part of an integrated service approach to ending Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence. Our service is delivered across Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly (CIOS) and it is called Safer Futures. Safer Futures is funded by Safer Cornwall, a partnership of statutory agencies in CIOS. Safer Futures offers a wide range of programmes to children, young people and adults who are affected by domestic abuse and sexual violence (DASV). Our programmes are designed to:

- Assist people who are in crisis
- Equip people to recover from the adverse effects of domestic abuse and sexual violence
- Educate children, young people and professionals about healthy relationships
- Upskill professionals to intervene early and prevent the escalation of issues

I am pleased to inform you that Safer Futures has been invited into your school to deliver the Healthy Relationships Programme (HRP) to Year 2 and Year 6 classes. This will take place during the week of the 29<sup>nd</sup> November. This programme is delivered by facilitators who provide age appropriate, healthy relationship messages to the children and young people within schools. The programme covers topics such as:

- Gender stereotyping
- Keeping our bodies safe
- Safe and unsafe secrets
- · Equality and diversity in society
- Managing conflict with peers
- Online safety and the law and consent.
