#### **HEAD TEACHER WEEKLY UPDATE**

This week, we have already started to focus on our OfSTED Feedback from the inspection last week by formulating some initial plans that will be developed further over the next few weeks and then implemented across the school as soon as possible. As stated last week, this Feedback (positive and the few areas for development) will be shared with the school community (children and parents) as soon as we are able to do so (there is a quality assurance process for this).

On Tuesday, I had an extremely busy day as I covered Year 3 in the morning and then went to Sailing with our Year 6 class. After school, I then did Football Club (Extra-Curricular activity) then attended a meeting about Curriculum Kernewek (Cornish Curriculum). On Wednesday, I continued to focus further on our Curriculum as I met with a Curriculum Advisor from the Local Authority. This was planned a couple of weeks ago, as there are further things that I want to focus on in relation to our Curriculum, but this also links to the main points of our inspection feedback. This meeting was extremely useful.

This week I have also been meeting Teachers to set personal targets for this academic year, as part of our performance management appraisal process. At the time of writing (Thursday evening) I am also looking forward to seeing children in green non uniform tomorrow to raise awareness of mental health, which is something that I try to highlight and focus on often, especially as it is even more pertinent as a result of Covid-19. Last week, after our inspection, I was unable to visit KS2 classes on Friday. I really enjoy Friday afternoon French sessions, at the time of writing, I am looking forward to the MFL French sessions this Friday afternoon when the focus is a recap on greetings and about how they are feeling.

Unfortunately, it is clear that Covid-19 is still around, as I have been made aware of a case this week. Therefore, I urge all families to stay safe and consider previous guidance to ensure your own and others' safety. Have a lovely weekend, best wishes,
