Last Thursday we took some children from Years 2, 3 and 4 to Luxulyan School to play some football friendlies. The games were arranged as we begin to



However, when with a PAT dog, children become less stressed, less self-conscious and more confident in reading out loud. Before long, children start to look forward to the reading experience and begin to associate reading with a positive

experience, as they are going to read to their new friend, Angel. PAT dogs also provide comfort, encourage positive social behaviours, enhance self-esteem, motivate speech and inspire young people to have fun reading.
