- Make sure that my child wears correct uniform and conforms to rules regarding the wearing of jewellery.
- Ensure that may child does not bring to school unnecessary items from home.
- Inform school staff of any problems that might affect my child's learning or behaviour.
- Check my child's book bag each day and encourage him/ her to complete homework to a high standard.
- Attend meetings to monitor my child's learning.
- Support the school to maintain good behaviour and discipline on school premises and, where appropriate, on school transport.
- Encourage my child to take advantage of opportunities that the school offers outside the classroom.
