⇒ Transition Week

Monday 17th July—Tuesday 25th July are our Transition weeks! Miss Moore will be doing some class cover throughout the week prior to her leaving us to start at her new school in September. Year 6 will be going to Brannel school, the new reception class will be joining us, and all the other years will be moving up a year. Please note that all classes must enter via their new classes. Below is the list of staff per class and the entrance and exit doors.

Eden (Reception): Mrs Hayes, Mrs Cookson and Miss Dash—Enter/ exit through the KS1 main double grey doors.

Hendra (Year 1): Miss Wood, Miss Rosevear and Mrs Wade— Enter/ exit through the KS1 main double grey doors.

Prosper (Year 2): Miss Morton (Miss Bevis from January) and Miss Grubb—Enter/ exit through the KS1 main double doors. **Karslake** (Year 3): Mr Tonkin and Mrs Varney—Enter/ exit through the Karslake class door (single door just past the KS1 main entrance doors).

Melbur (Year 4): Miss Morrison/Mrs Cooper and Mrs Miskowicz—Enter/ exit through the green KS2 double doors in the old build.

Drinnick (Year 5): Mr Barritt and Ms Grindrod—Enter through the green KS2 double doors, exit through Drinnick's external door.

Rosemellyn (Year 6): Mrs Jago, Mrs Williams and Mrs Kitts— Enter through the green KS2 double doors, exit through the library door.

⇒ <u>FunFit</u>

Just a reminder that today (Friday 14th July) is the last day of Funfit. Parents will be notified in September when it re-starts.

⇒ Road Markings—Re-paint and Signs

The signs to accompany the yellow zig zag markings at the front of the school have now been put up. This means that the local authority can now issue penalty notices to those who continue to park in this area, despite the importance of keeping it clear for pedestrians and passing motorists.

⇒ **Swimming**

Next week is our last week of swimming this term. Current years 3 to 5 will still be attending their swimming lesson, so please ensure that they have their swimming kit in school.

Next week at Brannel School is JulyFest! Our current year 5/6 will be participating at the Big Sing event as part of the JulyFest celebrations. They have one final rehearsal on Thursday 20th July 2pm-4pm, then they stay for the Performance 4pm-5pm. If there are any pupils who are not attending the evening event, they will remain at school. For the rehearsal, Brannel School will make arrangements for travel to Brannel during the school day. However, as the Big Sing takes place after school, you will need to make arrangements to collect your child from Brannel School at 5pm. The Big Sing generally takes place outside of the canteen, so if you walk through the entrance foyer and go down the steps to walk through the dining hall, you can collect your child from the external doors there. Mrs Wicks and Mrs Jago will be attending the Big Sing to ensure our pupils are collected safely. You are, of course, invited to the Big Sing and can watch the performances.
