If you have children attending different clubs, the club leader will hold on to children until you are able to collect them. This change will be on a trial basis, we will review the system again if this change is not effective.

⇒ **Y5/6 Hit the Surf Trip ~ 28/9/16**

On **Wednesday 28th September**, Drinnick and Rosemellyn class will be visiting Fistral Beach to take part in Hit the Surf beach safety sessions with the RNLI. We appreciate that there may be some reservations about children attending this trip due to the RNLI requirement that in order for children to take part in the water activities, they must be able to swim 25 metres. This requirement is solely to determine which children have the confidence and competence to take part in the set water activities, including surfing under RNLI supervision. They will not be expected to swim 25 metres on the day. There are lots of activities that the children will take part in, even if they do have confidence in the water. All children will participate in a water safety presentation and beach games and children who do not feel confident taking part in the set water activities can play in the shallows or rock pools under supervision. Please remember that children will need to bring a swimsuit and towel and wear comfortable clothing. If we have not yet received a consent form for your child, another copy has been sent home today. Please complete and return the form on Monday but please note that it is now too late to order a school packed lunch.

⇒ **Census Day Menu ~ 6/10/16**

To recognise the importance of Census day to schools and educational funding, Chartwells have organised a special Census day menu for **Thursday 6th October**. Instead of the usual menu, children can choose from southern baked chicken fillet with wedges or macaroni cheese with garlic bread. This menu has gone down very well with children in the past so it may be a great time for children unsure about school dinners to give it a go.

We are extremely fortunate to have an Olympic Athlete visit us on **Tuesday 27th September**. Antony James, an Olympic swimmer, will be coming into school to lead a sponsored fitness circuit with pupils and will follow up with a talk and a question and answer session.
