⇒ Transition Week - w/c 22/7/19

All children will be moving up to their September teachers next week. Year 6 children joining Brannel School in September have completed one week transition there this week and will continue there next week. Our new reception pupils will be visiting us from 9:00 to 11:30am each day. Drop off and collection points for each class are as follows:

Eden class (Reception) and **Hendra Class** (Year 1): Enter/exit through the KS1 main double grey doors.

Prosper class (Year 2): Enter through the grey KS1 double doors and exit through the Prosper classroom door.

Karslake class (Year 3): Enter through the grey KS1 double doors and exit through the Karslake classroom door.

Melbur class (Year 4): Enter through the library door and exit through the KS2 double doors.

Drinnick class (Year 5): Enter/exit through the library door in the old build.

Rosemellyn class (Year 6): Enter/ exit through Drinnick's (now Rosemellyn's) external door.

⇒ School Dinners 2019

Please can parents ensure that any outstanding school dinners are paid for as soon as possible, preferably by the end of term. Free school meals forms were sent home last week, if you meet the eligibility criteria please ensure you apply. A reminder that children in Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) who automatically qualify for free school meals, children in Key Stage 2 (Years 3, 4, 5 and 6) will still need to apply for them if you are eligible. Anyone that doesn't qualify , the cost is £2.30 a day, to be paid through Eschools.

⇒ School Dinners 2019/2020

As of September 2019 Caterlink will be providing our School Meals. They have employed Dean Robins as a new cook for us, we look forward to welcoming him to the school and working alongside him. We will be sending out the new menus shortly. If your child has any food allergies or intolerances, you must let Caterlink know. We have sent home new forms with children who have previously made us aware of food intolerances. Caterlink will need to see medical confirmation of your child's dietary needs before they will provide an additional menu.

Year 5 Bikeability

On Wednesday Year 5 did their level 1 Bikeability. Level 2 will be completed w/c Monday 21st July. Please ensure your child brings their bike and helmet with them. Sensible and comfortable clothing can be worn again.

⇒ Go Active Summer Holiday Clubs

Go Active will be holding 3 holiday clubs at Nanpean School on **Wednesday 7th, 14th and 21st August.** The cost is £7 a session or £20 for all three. Letters for this have been sent out so if your child would like to attend please complete and return consent forms as soon as possible. Payments need to be made via eschools by the **23rd July**.
