Welcome back everyone! We trust you all had a lovely Easter Holiday and are ready for the Summer Term.

⇒ Lockdown Policy & Procedure

A letter was sent home to parents on Thursday giving information about our procedures in the event of a lockdown. A lockdown is the opposite of our emergency evacuation procedures, in that children are all moved to an internal location in the event of a dangerous situation outside of the school. Mrs Wicks has ensured that all staff are aware of the school's lockdown procedures and will also be talking to the children in assembly on Monday. The purpose of this drill is not to panic anyone, but to ensure that we know what to do in all reasonably foreseeable situations. A lockdown drill will be undertaken sometime next week.
