### **HEAD TEACHER WEEKLY UPDATE**

I hope that you have had a good first full week back at school for the Spring Term following what was a miserable weekend of weather. Luckily, the weather during the week has been reasonable (for this time of year) and has meant that the children have been able to have plenty of fresh air. I even saw the Sun on Wednesday, which, despite the cold temperature, was a lovely, clear day!

As always, it has been a busy week at Nanpean School, as I am sure it is in all schools. I am always amazed and proud of all that we achieve and provide for the children each week. This week, I was involved in some Governor Monitoring on Monday, whereby Anne Bullock, one of our Governors visited myself (in relation to Safeguarding) and Miss Morrison (in relation to SEND provision). It was lovely to have Anne in school, as she is a very experienced school leader and has recently become a Governor for us now that she has retired from her role in the Local Authority.

On Tuesday, we reviewed attendance for December in our monthly meeting with Caroline Hunt, the Student Welfare Officer. There are only a few letters to go out as a result of this, and these will go out next week, but depending on attendance of individual children, more letters will go out as and when needed in response to any declining attendance. I also enjoyed working with Year 5 on Tuesday afternoon. I was impressed with their handwriting in that session, and then they had Anna Minear, a Music specialist, to teach their Music session. They all enjoyed playing the variety of instruments and I was impressed with the tunes played.

On Thursday, Miss Morton, Miss Morrison and I reviewed Data from individual classes for the Autumn Term. We then communicated to Teachers where we would like their attention and focus for this term to be, in response to the Data Outcomes. These will also (in future) inform Interventions when the current Intervention cycle ends and is planned again.

Throughout each morning this week, I have enjoyed circulating the school during Phonics and Reading sessions each morning (9 - 9.30am). I always enjoy the Read, Write, Inc sessions that Eden, Hendra and Prosper classes take part in each morning, and I sometimes join in myself!
