

⇒ **Nanpean Church Rooms Open Day / Coffee Morning**



On Saturday 9th December, between 11am and 1pm, Nanpean Church Rooms will be opening its doors to the public to view the interior of this landmark building, find out more on the proposals for it's future and to vote in the consultation. The Parish Council

has received a proposal to take the Church Rooms from a neglected former Sunday School to a convenience store, which will include a free cash point, hot food to go, coffee machine, alcohol and cigarette sales, Pay point services and parcel deliveries/ collections. This proposal means that some of the building would remain under the management of the Parish Council and these rooms would be available for community use/ events.

The car park would also remain under the management of the Parish Council and still be available for public parking with certain restrictions. The Parish Council will be going out to consultation on these proposals from Monday 27th November. The consultation will end on Saturday 9th December with the open day/ coffee morning. The consultation will consist of an online vote on the Parish Council website which gives you the option to support or oppose the proposals. For those who don't have access to the internet, paper voting slips are available from the Parish Council office or at the open day/coffee morning.

⇒ **Healthy Tuck**

We would like to remind parents that children should have healthy snacks during their tuck break. Children can bring in their own snacks to have at break time, however, these should be healthy (not chocolate, crisps, etc). Key Stage 1 have free fruit and Key Stage 2 can purchase tuck from the tuck trolley (for 20p a day), where there is a selection of healthy snacks.



⇒ **Prosper's Pendennis Trip ~ 28.11.2017**

Just a quick reminder that Prosper class (Year 2) are going on their trip to Pendennis Castle on **Tuesday 28th November**. If you haven't ordered a school packed lunch for your child, you will need to send one in from home with your child on this day. Children do not need to wear their full school uniform but must wear comfortable clothing and their red school jumpers. As the weather is getting very chilly of late, children will need a warm coat and a hat and sensible walking shoes. The coach will be leaving Nanpean School promptly at 9am so all children need to be in before this time for registration.
