The children will be able to talk about different places in their school, home and local environment.




Our class books for this term will be 'The Everywhere Bear' by Julia Donaldson

Reading

We will have Read, Write, Inc. sessions every day where we will practice learning our sounds to help us decode. At the end of everyday, we will have story time.
