Letters were sent home on Thursday regarding Parents Evening, which will be taking place on Tuesday 7th November, between 3:30 and 6:30pm and Wednesday 8th November, between 1:30 and 4:30pm. To book a time online please visit the eSchools site (instructions are on the letter). If you are unable to book online, please complete the slip and send back to school. Please note that any paper slips that we receive will be given a time after the eSchools booking has closed. This means that you may not be allocated your chosen time. If you have more than one child's teacher to see, please leave a 10 minute gap between each appointment to give you sufficient time to finish one meeting and get to the next. Each appointment will only be 10 minutes long. If you feel that you have more to discuss with your child's teacher, you will need to arrange a separate appointment with them.

⇒ Music Lessons

On Thursday, Colin Friend from the Cornwall Music Trust Service gave a musical demonstration of the types of instruments that he can teach to pupils. We were treated to songs from Harry Potter and Adele during the assembly. Mr Friend can teach the Recorder, Saxophone, Oboe or flute. Lessons take place at school during Friday lunchtimes. 
- ⇒ No Film Club on Monday 16th October

⇒ Attendance letters

As a school, we are proud to have a good attendance record. We monitor attendance on a monthly basis with our student welfare officer and a school governor. High attendance is celebrated through: Head Ted (our weekly attendance teddy for the class with the highest attendance that week); positive letters sent home were attendance has notably improved; and rewarding 100% attendance with certificates on a termly basis and prizes for 100% attendance for the year. However, as positive as we aim to be in praising great attendance, we also have to make parents aware where attendance falls below our expectations. At our school where attendance falls below 90% (and therefore is at risk of persistent absenteeism) or where attendance is below 95% and declines for at least two months in a row, letters will be sent out informing parents of this. This early in the year, just 2 days absence will bring your child's attendance below 90% so please don't be alarmed if you have received a letter; where attendance improves, there will be no further action. We apologise if parents feel the letter sounds a bit harsh but we try and make them as informative as possible to ensure that all parents/ carers are aware of the repercussions of persistent absence.
