Mia Henderson: "On Wednesday 21st June, Karslake class went to a river/ beach trip. We went on a fancy, comfortable and nice bus to go to Pentewan beach and we all went across a long, long path. We then we got into groups: The group with Miss Moore was measuring the depth of the river, the group with Miss Rosevear helped with chucking the orange in the river and helping us with the stop watches, and the group with Miss Williams was trying to find different plants in a transect. We had a long walk to Pentewan where we all ate our lunch, and when everyone ate their lunch, we went to see the cute, little ducklings on the pond. Then we went back to the park and on the basket swing, Reuben, Charlie and Corey pushed us really high. We then went back to the bus stop and went back to school".

Jason Stead: "On Wednesday 21st June, Karslake class went on a trip to St Austell river and Pentewan Beach. We went on a St Austell foot path. We went into 3 groups and we counted the plants with a square and we measured the depth of the river and how wide it was. We timed the orange with a stopwatch. We then went on a long walk to Pentewan beach and we ate our lunch. After that, we went to see some ducklings hatch, then we went to pick some stones up.

After that, we went back to the first bit of the beach. We then went to the park on the beach where there was a slide, swings and a lot more fun things and we played cricket for a little time.
