Next week is our Year 6 SATS week. We are already incredibly proud of the hard work that the children have put in towards preparing for these SATs and only ask that they do their best. \Rightarrow Year 2 SATs ~ w/c 21st May 2018

Year 2 children will be doing their SATs week commencing 21st May 2018. These are the National Curriculum tests for Reading and Maths and the children will sit them in groups in their classroom. We will not be reporting the marks children achieve in these tests as they simply help inform teacher assessment, which will be reported to parents in July. It is important that all pupils are in school that week. Although, children should not be made to worry about these tests, please ensure that the children get plenty of sleep and eat a good breakfast every day so they are able to do their best, and please arrive promptly at 8:45am so that the children are ready to start on time.

Rosemellyn—Jack McGall for improving his home reading this week. Keep up the effort!


LUNCHTIME AWARD

Reading Challenge Reward ~ 12/7/18

Children can earn points by reading at home (1 point per day) or by passing their AR quizzes (3 for 100%, 2 for passing). The children have until **Monday 9th July** when final point totals will be counted.
